We are a nonprofit organization working to break the cycle of poverty by accelerating economic mobility through education and early career support for first-generation students. La Próxima Generación program supports students through critical transitions, from junior year of high school through college and early career.

Position Summary

Our College Success Coaches play a vital role in the La Próxima Generación program by providing oneon-one academic and career support to MiHC college students. As a CSC, you will serve as a guide, mentor, and advocate for students as they navigate the challenges of college persistence. This role requires a strong commitment to supporting students from diverse, low-income backgrounds, many of whom are first-generation college students. The ideal candidate will bring experience in college access and persistence, a deep understanding of the needs of low-income and first-generation students, and a passion for empowering students throughout their educational journey. Additionally, candidates should be ready to utilize MiHC's toolkit (including CoPilot and CareerSpring online tools), participate in MiHCprovided trainings, and collaborate closely with program staff and leadership.

Responsibilities

Job responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Conduct one-on-one student meetings with assigned students at a frequency determined by MiHC program structure.
- Build relationships with MiHC scholars to effectively serve as a guide, advocate, and mentor.
- Maintain relationships with college partners to further support MiHC scholars.
- Support students in completing necessary tasks related to college persistence, including FAFSA completion, class schedule, resource identification, career exposure, and internships/job applications, etc.
- Maintain student data in MiHC's databases to monitor student progress.
- Leverage and enhance existing resources, research, and learning opportunities through MiHC's partnerships.
- Engage with students through a variety of methods to encourage meaningful participation in the MiHC program.



- Collect and synthesize success stories to establish and bolster a college-going culture in the community.
- Serve on cross-functional committees or working groups, contributing to discussions and initiatives.
- Other duties as assigned.

Skills & Qualifications

- Passion for MiHC's mission, goals, and priorities.
- Bachelor's Degree from an accredited 4-year university is required.
- Minimum of 3 years of experience in college counseling, college advising, or a related field.
- Mastery of college access, college persistence, and proficiency in Co-Pilot, following MiHC-provided training.
- Relationship building experience with college students.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to manage professional relationships across diverse stakeholders.
- Adaptable, collaborative, and flexible.
- Preference for demonstrated experience working with first-generation and low to moderate-income students.
- Student-focused: capable of adapting to diverse student needs.
- Broad experience supporting college students overcoming challenges and achieving success.
- Competency assisting college students through their academic and career goals.
- Fluency in Spanish is preferred but not required.
